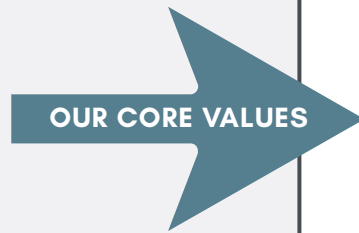

2024 ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

Oct. 20, 2024

First Baptist Church of Stanleyville

Rev. Virgil Dwyer, Pastor of First Baptist Church of Stanleyville, welcomed everyone and led the Scripture reading and Invocation.

Rev. Jeremy Parker, Moderator, issued a call to order. He invited everyone to look over last year's minutes and called for a vote. The minutes were approved.

Congregational music and worship followed led by David Brown from Crestwood Baptist Church.

Rev. Brad Wright, Triad Church Network (TCN) Executive Director, thanked churches for their contributions to TCN. He reminded everyone gathered that we need one another for strength, encouragement, and resources. He also invited everyone gathered to the 2025 Marriage Retreat at the Grandover Resort along with other opportunities.

Rev. Brad Wright addressed the Hurricane Helene efforts of TCN churches and shared a story of a Zoom call earlier this week where an aid opportunity led to a gospel presentation and a salvation.

Rev. Brad Wright shared an opportunity to partner with another association in the western part of the state. Our association is going to pay for their associations pastor appreciation banquet. He invited those gathered to reach out to take part. 10,000 NC Baptists have already served in the Western part of our state.

Rev. Brad Wright encouraged those gathered that the church is on the move and the Father is on the move as more people are coming to know Christ. He introduced the theme of "Stories" and shared that we would hear more of what God is doing in and through TCN churches.

More congregational music and worship followed.

Rev. Jeremy Parker shared that the Book of Reports could be found on the Triad Church Network website.

Rev. Parker welcomed True Point Church and Iglesia Bautista de Restauracion and called for a vote to welcome them as members of TCN. The motion was approved.

Rev. Parker called for the removal of Waughtown Baptist Church from membership, as they are closing their doors permanently on December 31st. The motion passed.

Rev. Parker called attention to some changes to the bi-laws to bring it up to date to how we function now. He invited those gathered to review those changes, and he reminded those gathering that no vote is required.

Rev. Parker called attention to a membership recommendation in the Book of Reports. The leadership prayerfully considered to add these membership recommendations. The recommendation can be found on pg. 11-12 of the Book of Reports. These changes do not require a second, but Rev. Parker opened up the floor for any further questions and discussion. Rev. Parker called for a vote to affirm these changes. The motion was approved.

Rev. Todd Parker, Treasurer, reported on the Associational Budget, noting that expenses were down significantly due to the sale of the Waughtown property, they were able to double the planned budget for the food pantry, and fund new church plants in the regular and designated budget, and able to increase salaries. Rev. Todd Parker proposed the 2025 Associational Budget.

Rev. Parker reminded that the budget recommendation does not require a second because it is coming from the committee.

Tim at Green Tree asked what the difference was between the general and designated budget.

Rev. Todd Parker explained the difference.

Rev. Jeremy Parker called for a vote to affirm the budget, and the budget was approved.

Rev. Jeremy Parker presented the candidates for officers for 2025, listed in the book of records. He also recognized the TCN staff.

A vote of affirmation then followed this announcement. The new board was approved and prayed over.

Rev. A.J Reynolds introduced and prayed over the Jim Hamblin Local Mission offering.

More congregational music followed.

Rev. Brad Wright introduced a time of telling stories of what God has done in our TCN churches this past year. He reminded the association of Exodus 14 where God says, stop talking and move. Get up and go. He reminded pastors the importance of practicing personal evangelism and called them to engage with the lost.

He challenged those gathered to start thinking about where they are sitting on the sidelines and how God is asking them to move and speak.

Rev. Brad Wright introduced Rev. Dave Beverly of Triad Journey Church in Midway. He shared about his church partnering with a Community Group at Two Cities helping to run a dental truck for a free clinic where they could share the gospel, pray, get to know those in need in their community, and serve them. A dental assistant drove all the way from Siler City having no clue it was at a church. Volunteers had an opportunity to share the gospel with the dental assistant and she prayed to receive Christ.

Rev. Brad Wright shared a video update from Rev. Dustin Connor from Hope Hills Church, a church planter in Calgary, Canada. He thanked TCN for their support and shared stories of life change. Rev. Connor shared that his son Kirk came to know Christ. He also shared about a Chinese woman in their community whose son and daughter have come to their kids camps, and they invited her to do a discovery Bible study. She attended church for the first time recently. He shared a story of his Muslim barber coming to the Easter service, and they read and discuss the Bible every time he goes to get his hair cut now. Rev. Brad Wright invited everyone to pray for Rev. Connor and his family.

Rev. Brad Wright invited Amanda Brown to share. Amanda shared that she was a graduate from Pivot Ministries. She shared about growing up in chaos, and how two years ago she hit rock bottom as an alcoholic. God brought her to Brookhaven Baptist where she found unconditional love and a family. She was connected to Pivot and God gave her the tools to see her purpose and strengths, and move towards them.

A video played from Calvary Baptist Church about an agnostic man who came to know Christ. Maria Weisz shared a story from a Community Group at Two Cities multiplying to create two groups, and how one couple stepping out and starting a group led to a young woman joining the group and coming to know Christ.

A video from Baptist Children's home played about a family who fostered a boy, had spiritual conversations with him, and saw him come to know Christ and be baptized.

Rev. Brad Stamey of Bethany Baptist Church shared a story of a young single mom in their church who gave her life to Christ, was baptized, and since then she has grown tremendously. The Lord blessed her with a home from habitat from humanity. Now, she serves in their church and reaches out to young women coming out of brokenness. She is also witnessing to her sister and trying to get her to understand about faith in Christ.

A video from Two Cities Church played about generational discipleship.

Rev. Jeremy Parker spoke to those gathered about feeling discouraged in ministry in 2021 and not having any baptisms, now in 2024 he celebrated seeing 30 baptisms.

Rev. A.J. Reynolds recalled Psalm 34 "Taste and see that the Lord is good." Rev. Reynolds called attention to the back page of the book of reports and the 2025 annual meeting details. Rev. Reynolds also drew attention to page 38 and an error there. Contact Beth, Maria or Brad, and they will share the correct information. He thanked First Baptist of Stanleyville, their pastor, and pastor of worship. He also wanted to thank Brad Wright for making this meeting a success, and to Beth and Maria. Rev. Reynolds made a motion to adjourn. The motion passed.

Kari Wilson, Clerk, Communications Director of Two Cities Church, then closed the meeting with a prayer.

2 Corinthians 5:18-21 (ESV)

As we've said for years now, "You can move from surviving to thriving!"

Church Planting efforts continue to thrive in this area. We are so excited to partner with those called to start new work in this area, and God is bringing some of the sharpest folks to our communities to start new churches. Get to know these guys, and see how your church can partner with them to have Gospel impact!

Leadership Development continues to be an area of focus for your association. Whether it's continued training in specific areas of ministry, the marriage retreat, or our new series "Answers & Insight", TCN is bringing our pastors and church leaders some of the best voices to speak into areas of need. We are helping pastors and church staff through LeaderCare and MarriageCare, which has yielded tremendous fruit for those who needed help at just the right time.

LEADERSHIP REPORTS

2025 LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT

On behalf of your Leadership Team, it is my great privilege to submit to you, the messengers, this report. During 2025, your Leadership Team has worked to faithfully and diligently steer this association to support, resource, undergird, and encourage its churches.

As a Board of Directors, we have dealt with some nuts and bolts of the Network's operations, from dealing with the fall-out of a stolen Community Outreach Trailer, to giving direction to our communications scheme. We have provided oversight, striving to practice faithful stewardship of the budget you approved last October. In doing so, we have had the flexibility to make some Kingdom investments.

We were able to support the First Baptist Church of King in their efforts to reconstruct a major portion of the building of River View Baptist Church up in Creston, following last autumn's flooding. At the end of July, we were able to make a significant gift to the Hill Country Baptist Association in central Texas to support their ministry efforts following another flooding disaster.

We have also availed dollars for pastors receiving sabbatical periods from their church, dollars to supplement mission projects, especially Serve N.C. projects in August, and dollars for ministers needing counseling. Perhaps a favorite investment in my opinion, is to assist in underwriting the cost of our pastors' participation in the Tar Heel Leadership Network, facilitated by our own Dr. Steve Corts at Center Grove Church in Clemmons!

More importantly than managing finances, we have had the great honor to serve churches, and their pastors in particular. We are providing resources for learning and fellowship through Answers & Insights workshops. We have given several leaders opportunities to participate in a vision mission trip.

We also provided a top-tier pastor/wife Marriage Retreat at the end of the winter. I have personally heard from multiple participants that the Marriage Retreat this-past March is the greatest personal investment any association has ever made in any pastor. We are so glad to provide learning and refreshment and encouragement to pastors and their wives, because we acknowledge that only after a man is a good and godly leader of his own home, can he ever be a good and godly leader of God's church.

As we continue in the paradigm of a decentralized association of churches, we are more and more dependent upon our community Impact Groups, organized by geographic zones and affinity groups. My church has received direct benefit from the Impact Group available to administrative professionals. One of my personal goals this year was to visit other Impact Groups across the footprint of the Network, with the simple desire to meet more people and get to know the saints throughout our churches. From greeting people as they arrive at the Marriage Retreat to visiting other Impact Groups, it has been a profound joy to get to know better, some of God's best servants across this association. We are extremely grateful for all those who work to coordinate these Impact Groups, because they are increasingly becoming the backbone of this Network.

I know that I speak for the entire Leadership Team when I express great appreciation to all those who have given so generously of their time to serve on our Finance Committee and Personnel Committee. Words cannot begin to express how indebted we all are to our T.C.N. staff: Beth, Maria, and Brad. Our association of churches is extremely spoiled to have such great people working to serve us.

In a moment of personal privilege, I'd like to express gratitude that this Network has entrusted to me this opportunity to serve. You first elected me in October 2016 to take part in one of the four Focus Groups we had in the previous organizational structure. It is humbling to consider how God has allowed me to meet, know, and befriend some of the wisest, most talented, and faithful brothers/sisters in Christ within the whole of God's Kingdom.

It is a joy to know that Heaven will be fuller because of the witness of the churches in this association. Should He continue to tarry, and we're around for another 140 years, I look forward to further advancement of the Kingdom, churches planted, disciples raised up, and souls saved! 2025 PERSONNEL TEAM REPORT

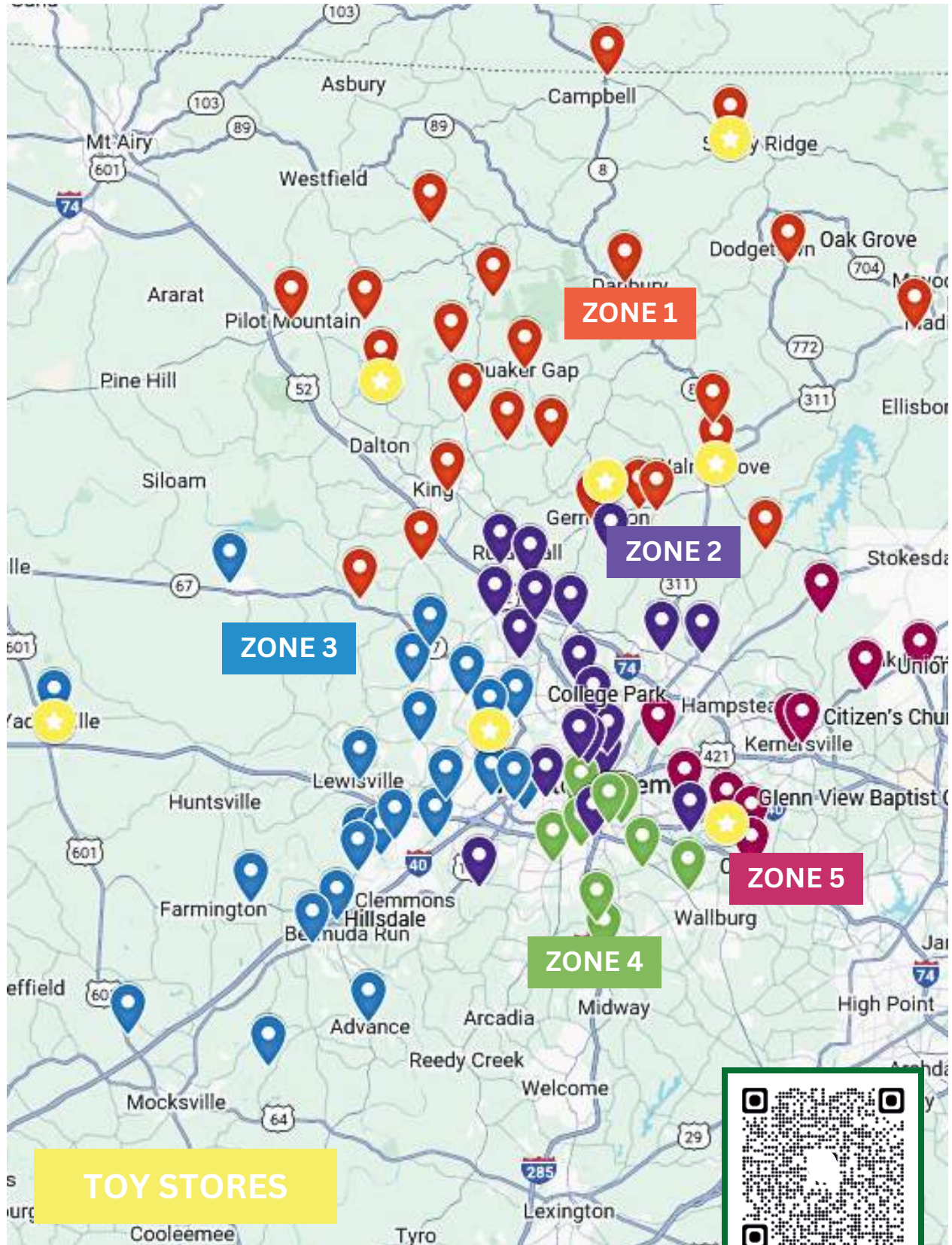

RISE CHURCH SOUTHSIDE WINSTON

It is an exciting season in the life of Rise Church! Rise has existed in Southside Winston-Salem for 8 years now and when we stop and reflect on all that has taken place we are overwhelmed by God's grace and goodness. A small church plant that started with several of our neighbors meeting in our home for prayer, worship, and fellowship over a meal - is now a family of disciples seeking to love one another and our community. We meet on Mondays for "Kingdom Prayer" where we plead with God to move in powerful ways to advance His Kingdom. Simultaneously, a group of men, women, and children walk the streets of our community praying, making new contacts, and strengthening relationships with our neighbors. Each Wednesday we meet for a time of fellowship over a shared meal where we encourage one another, laugh together, and grieve together. Through many transitions and facilities, God has faithfully sustained the weekly time of gathered worship on Sunday evenings.

This past May we celebrated 3 new graduates of our internship program, the Crimson Crown Institute. This is a program seeking to disciple and develop members of our community to faithfully serve Christ in ministry and the workplace. Our current class just launched with another 3 eager interns as well! Our residency program, Righteous Oaks Residency which seeks to develop ministry leaders called to serve among urban poor communities, has seen our first 2 residents go on to launch our afterschool program called RAP (Rise Afterschool Program). This program serves our elementary students in the southside 3 days a week from 3:30-5:30, as well as middle school students through various club offerings. This program serves students at Rise Academy, which was launched in 2018 with our first Kindergarten class. We are now a K-7 th school serving 60 students and growing! God has continually blessed us with incredible students, families, and staff! Additionally, our school would not be possible without the many volunteers through partnering local churches, many of whom are through our affiliation with TCN!

To further our efforts to make Rise Academy a vehicle for holistic discipleship, we have launched Royalty Mentoring (a Christ-centered mentoring program) and Royal Path (a Rite of Passage program walking rising 6th graders through graduation on the path to become Kingdom Men and Women). 2025 also saw a dream come to reality with the launch of our first ever "Shalom Summit." Shalom Summit is a weekend long initiative to shed light on a particular area of injustice, where God's peace is robbed from communities, and rally Jesus followers to step into this area of need through lament, prayer, and action. We are excited to see these programs grow as more mentors are trained and matched with students, more leaders are developed, and more disciples come together to see God's Kingdom come in Winston-Salem as it is in Heaven!

Thank you TCN for all you have done and continue to do to help us RISE!

- We developed 5 simple discipleship tools to help not-yet and new believers along a pathway of finding and following Christ that I'd be happy to share and do trainings with.
- We saw Discovery Bible Studies help non-believers from various religious and ethnic backgrounds come to Christ and I have a workshop based on that I can come do.
- We created a simple discipleship pathway that starts with non-believers and integrates creative outreach, effective evangelism, and clear discipleship steps to help people know how to find and follow Jesus and help others do the same.

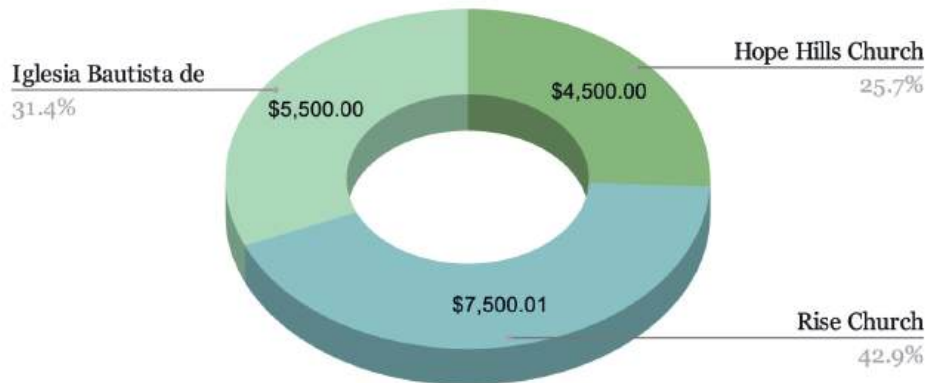

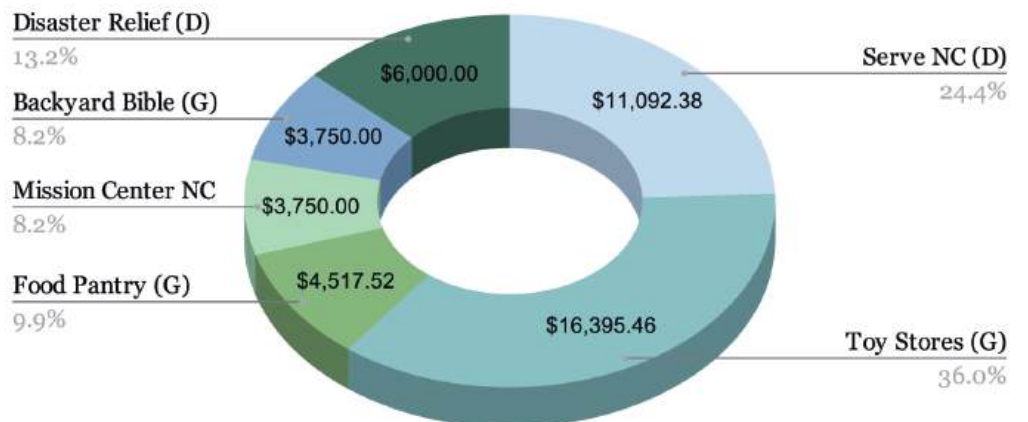

- 05-5210 Toy Stores: Toy distribution for needy families during the Christmas Season that covers most areas of our Network including Forsyth, Stokes, Yadkin and Davie counties.
- 05-5225 Hunger Initiatives: TCN's ministry to the hungry in our communities.
- 05-5230 Multi-Housing Ministries (Mission Center NC): This gospel-based, holistic ministry to people living in multi-housing units shares the Gospel and disciples people in their own communities. NAMB missionaries David and Kathy Parsons lead this initiative.
- 05-5235 Rural Outreach Ministries (Backyard Bible Club): Rodney and Sherri Montgomery lead a ministry in the Germanton area that reaches unchurched children and their families with the Gospel. This also includes meeting physical needs through food distribution, backpacks, etc.
- 05-5245 Rise Church, Winston-Salem: Joe and Duncan Maye planted a church and started Rise Academy, a k-5th Grade school, in the Southside area. They mentor children, youth and adults, and now have a 2-year residency program.

CHURCH HEALTH

- 05-5310 Impact Group Leader Resources: Funds to assist Impact Groups in training of leaders.
- 05-5315 Youth Response Team: TCN partners with our youth ministers to sponsor outreach and disciple-making events for the youth of our area.

CHURCH PLANTING

- 05-5420 Hope Hills Church, Calgary, Canada: Hope Hills Church in Calgary was planted with the help of TCN churches and Dustin Conner. In summer of 2025, Dustin and his family returned to Winston-Salem to join the staff of Calvary Baptist Church. The new pastor is Jamie Hunka, and Hope Hills continues to reach the people of Calgary with the hope of the Gospel.

- 05-5430 Iglesia Bautista de Restauracion: A church plant out of Old Town Baptist Church in partnership with TCN. Pastor Gilmer Mauricio and IBR joined the network under watch care in 2024.

The TCN Leadership Team asks our church plant partners to submit annual reports to the Association to be presented in the book of reports. Additionally, after 3 years of support, the Leadership Team will request an updated report to determine future funding support or fading of support as these churches become independent and viable on their own.

ADMINISTRATIVE

Staff Salaries/Benefits

- 05-6110 Executive Director: The Executive Director is a fulltime position. This person directs the TCN staff, provides general oversight of the organization, coaches pastors and churches regarding church health issues, and directs activities designed to help TCN fulfill its purpose.
- 05-6130 Ministry Assistant: This is a part-time role. This person provides help in areas of communication, marketing and administrative support.
- 05-6130 Financial Assistant: This is a part-time role. This person provides help to pay bills, disperse budget-approved funds, record financial transactions, and provide regular financial reports.
- 05-6150 Payroll Taxes: This area represents our total tax liabilities regarding personnel expenses.

Office Expenses

- 05-6210 Office Supplies: Covers any supplies, materials or small equipment purchases needed to operate the office.
- 05-6215 Marketing & Promotion: Involves both existing and new costs for creating publications to be shared with both our churches and our communities.
- 05-6220 Postage: Covers single item and bulk mail costs.
- 05-6225 Technology Support: The maintenance and upkeep of the copier, computers, phones, internet and website.

TRIAD CHURCH NETWORK Glossary of Terms

DESIGNATED BUDGET

The Designated Budget was established in the 2016 to provide strategic, supplemental funds in addition to the approved General Budget in areas of church planting, church revitalization, community ministry, pastoral support and disaster relief.

CHURCH HEALTH (05-1001)

- 05-1004 Impact Group Meetings: This provides additional funds to help promote and expand the ministry of Impact Groups.
- 05-1005 Other: This represents other unforeseen needs or opportunities we can help meet in promoting church health.

CHURCH PLANTING (05-2001)

- 05-2006 Other Projects: This represents other unforeseen needs we can help meet in promoting church planters.
- 05-2008 New Work Support: This provides for one-time gifts used to help new works get off the ground.

COMMUNITY IMPACT (05-3001)

- 05-3003 Disaster Recovery: TCN has historically supported projects to help people who have undergone disaster, particularly in partnership with Baptists on Mission.
- 05-3004 Other Projects: This represents other unforeseen needs we can help meet in ministering to our communities.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT (05-4001)

- 05-4002 MarriageCare: TCN helps offset the costs of our annual Marriage Retreat making it as affordable as possible. In addition, the Network provides Marriage Counseling for ministry couples who either need a “check-up” or more interventional assistance through a local Christian counseling ministry.
- 05-4003 LeaderCare: The Network provides up to 6 free counseling sessions for ministers or their family members. In addition, TCN also provides coaching sessions to develop life skills for the long-haul challenges of ministry.

ORGANIZATIONAL RESERVE (05-5001)

- 05-5001 General Budget Reserves: This area covers unforeseen facility or ministry needs, particularly with fees and other operational issues.

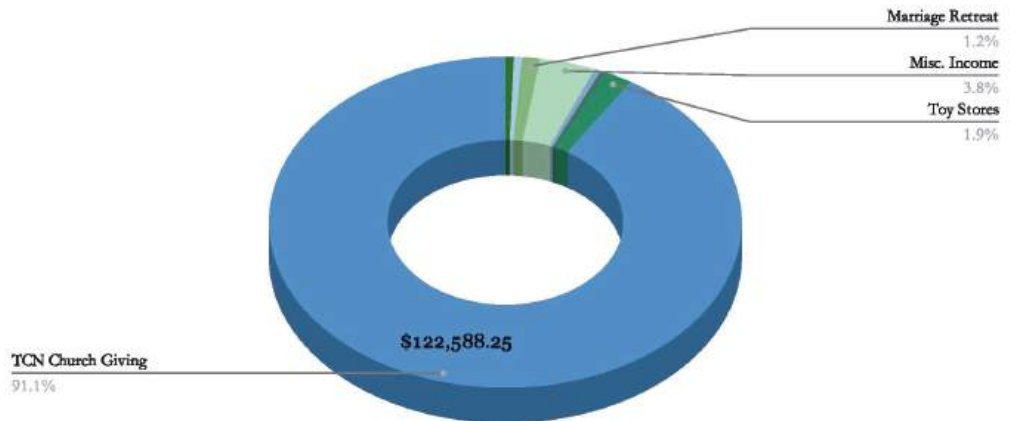

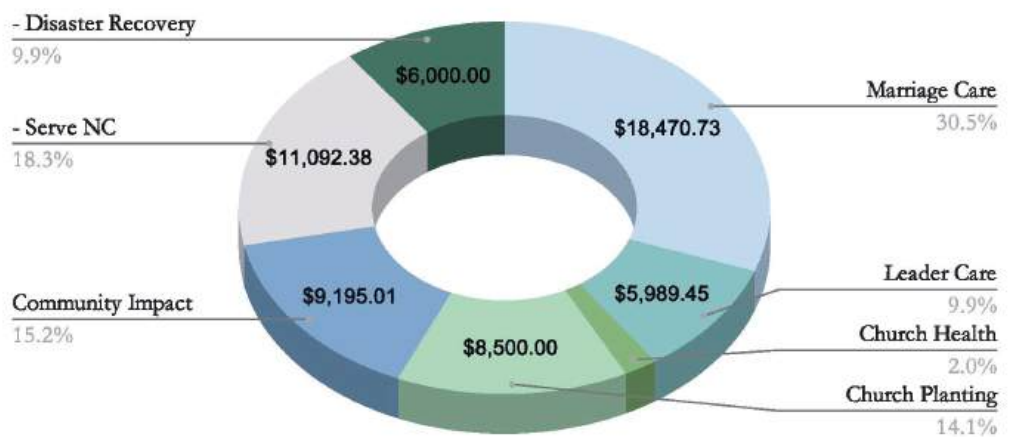

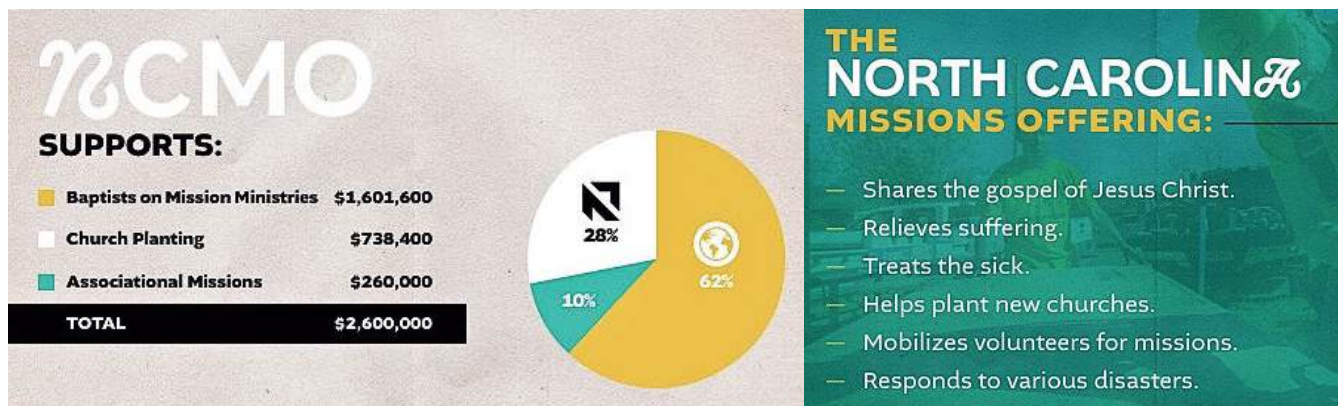

BAPTISTS ON MISSION AREAS OF WORK

At Baptists on Mission, our Purpose is to Glorify God by involving churches and Christians in meeting human needs in Jesus' name. We do that by offering a wide variety of opportunities for volunteers to be the hands and feet of Jesus. Everything from aviation missions where we fly patients to much-needed medical care, partnership missions, prayer ministries, medical, dental, construction, disaster relief, disaster recovery, etc. Baptists on Mission volunteers serve in 19 ministries that include the following:

STATE/NATIONAL/INTERNATIONAL MISSION PROJECTS

God is changing lives through mission trips sponsored by Baptists on Mission in North Carolina (mission camps, Impact NC, Disaster Rebuilds, etc.) and to places such as Pennsylvania, Hawaii, New England, Rocky Mountain Region, Appalachian Coalfields, Alaska, Guatemala, Kenya, Armenia, Romania, Hungary, Moldova, Cuba, South Africa and other places. Many hundreds of volunteers serve in these partnerships every year, with 173 teams and 2,395 volunteers participating in national partnerships and internationally we sent 84 teams and 702 volunteers to 10 difference countries. Lives are being changed... The British missionary William Carey said, "Expect great things from God; attempt great things for God." Here are some of the things that we as NC Baptists have been doing to minister to people and to glorify God:

DISASTER RELIEF

Baptists on Mission are exceptionally well-prepared for disaster relief, thanks to the dedication of our volunteers and the comprehensive equipment we've been blessed with. Our capabilities are extensive, featuring five large disaster feeding units, two of which can prepare and serve over 30,000 meals daily. Beyond feeding, we have a vast network of more than 250 disaster recovery trailers, owned by local churches and associations, specifically designed for clean-up and repair work after an event. Our support services are robust, including six large shower units, three laundry units, a childcare unit, several large recovery units, and numerous generator units, all provided to aid communities in need. The profound impact of our efforts was clearly demonstrated after Hurricane Helene, where we provided 500,000 hot meals, performed mud-outs, tear-outs, and chainsaw jobs on over 5,000 homes, completed over 9,000 loads of laundry, and facilitated over 18,000 showers. This massive undertaking was made possible by the incredible commitment of over 13,000 volunteers who mobilized within the first three months of the response.

DISASTER REBUILD

North Carolina has been hit hard by several severe storms: Hurricane Florence in September 2018, Tropical Storm Fred in August 2021, and Hurricane Helene in 2024. These events affected thousands of families across our state.

God has blessed us with six rebuild centers located in Black Mountain, Boone, Burnsville, East Flat Rock, and Spruce Pine. These centers are vital for housing, feeding, and coordinating the work of thousands of volunteers dedicated to rebuilding efforts. So far, we've helped over 2,000 families in eastern North Carolina and 330 families impacted by Helene in western North Carolina return home. However, many more families still need assistance to rebuild their lives years after these devastating storms. We will be rebuilding homes in western North Carolina for the next 5 years. Through our work, people in great need are experiencing the love of Christ, leading many to commit or recommit their lives to Jesus.

MEDICAL/DENTAL MISSIONS

Baptists on Mission offers the use of the mobile medical/dental units to Baptist and non-Baptist churches and service organizations within North Carolina who wish to reach out to people in need. More than 170 clinics are held each year on the 4 mobile units. Patients targeted through this ministry may include the impoverished, ethnic groups, farm workers, fair workers, the homeless, the elderly, and more.

HEALTH SCREENING MINISTRY

Health disparities are prevalent in more impoverished neighborhoods. Our goal is to take healthcare to the most disadvantaged populations, thus improving community health navigation as we align local community health centers with patients seen at the mobile clinics. The unit's health screening tests include Hemoglobin A1C for diabetes screening, finger stick glucose, Cholestech LDX for total cholesterol and HDL results, body mass index calculation, depression screening, basic eye exams, and vital signs assessment. This ministry provides not only basic health screening clinics but spiritual assessments and counseling as well. Our hope is that by meeting a physical need, a spiritual door will be opened, and the love of Jesus can be shared.

PROVISION FINANCIAL RESOURCES OF NC BAPTISTS, INC.

Highlights

In February 2024, Provision implemented a redemptive investing strategy that promotes human flourishing around the world. More information about redemptive investing can be found at provision.org/investing.

Chris Jones joined the Provision Team as VP, Regional Director in June 2024, and Kevin Qualls was welcomed as EVP, Ministry Impact Strategies in November 2024. Sarah Welch also joined the team in December 2024 as Executive Assistant.

Online statement access for account holders was launched in September 2024.

Provision established the OneFund as a simplified way to support diverse Christian causes such as scholarships, adoption and foster care, disaster relief, church planting, and more. Through this unified giving effort, individuals, churches, and organizations can receive both ongoing support and immediate relief when needs arise.

Renovations on the Provision office building in Cary began in June 2024 and were completed in March 2025.

Provision relaunched the Donor-Advised Fund program and introduced a new online platform for efficiency and flexibility in giving.

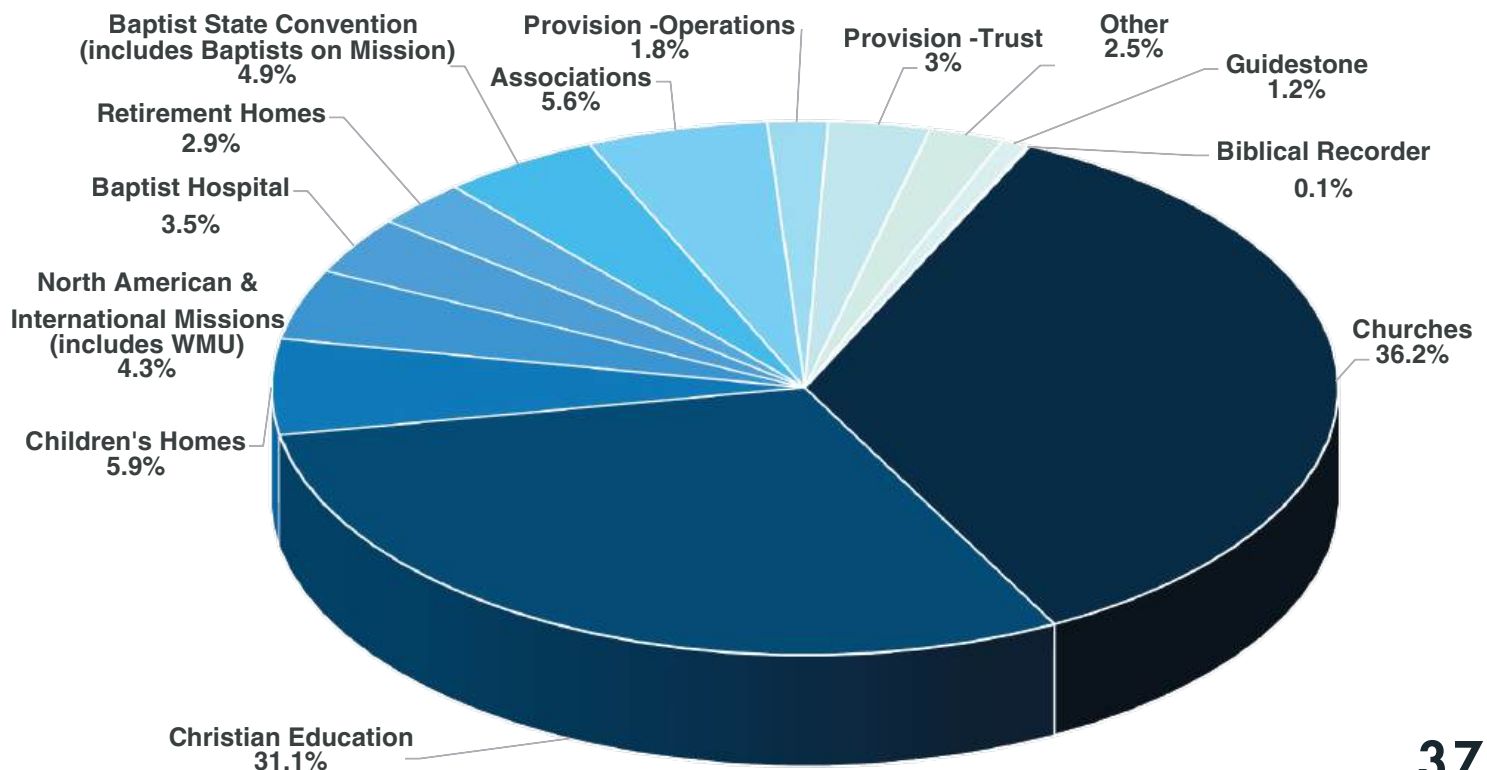
Provision continues to offer a free online estate planning resource that is available to all NC Baptists. To date, 180+ people have engaged with the resource, committing \$9.9 million to churches and other ministries through their estates.

In 2024, Provision distributed \$9.9 million to NC Baptists.

In 2024, Provision awarded 140 scholarships to NC Baptist students totaling \$251,900.

In 2024, Provision awarded 60 ministry grants to NC Baptist churches and associations totaling \$84,711.

In 2024, Provision closed 16 church loans totaling \$9.4 million.

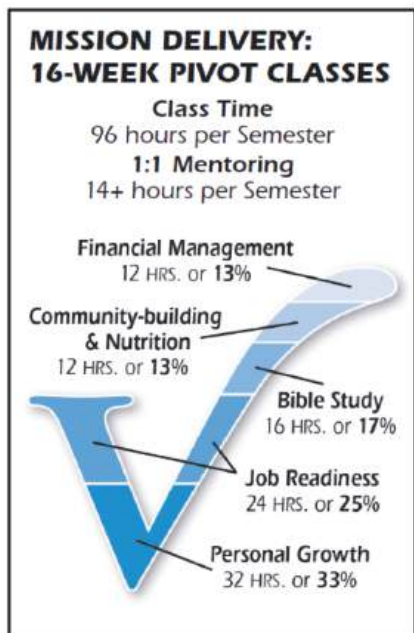

David brings a renewed focus for BCH to be a gospel-centered organization that brings hope to the vulnerable and comes alongside churches in their efforts to make the name of Jesus known.
- **BCH Adopts BF&M 2000:** In April 2025, the BCH Board approved the Baptist Faith & Message 2000 as BCH's official statement of faith, establishing a clear, Gospel-centered foundation for ministry and partnerships moving forward.
- **New Trainings Widen BCH's Ability to Equip and Empower Churches:**
Gospel-centered, trauma-informed trainings were developed so churches can compassionately care for the vulnerable and see discipleship flourish:
 - Children's and Youth Ministry Teams and congregations are empowered to launch and strengthen initiatives that foster resiliency, safety, and spiritual growth for families impacted by brokenness.
 - Leaders and volunteers are equipped to serve families impacted by Autism Spectrum Disorder, building ministries of sensitivity & belonging.
- **Fifteen Birth Mothers Make Decisions for Christ:** Christian Adoption Services, a BCH ministry, offers the annual retreat to encourage birth mothers who have chosen adoption for their babies and share the hope of the Gospel with them.
- **Ride to Clyde Marks 10th Anniversary with Record Amount Raised:** Organized in partnership with NC Baptists and benefiting BCH, motorcyclists celebrated the milestone year by raising \$261,367.

Across all of our communities, we provided over \$3,241,000 in aid to 52 individuals in our most recent fiscal year. We cared for 37 individuals at the Brookridge health care facility who needed financial aid and whose average length of stay was 187 days. In the last year, ThriveMore provided financial assistance to 14 residents of our Taylor House assisted living community- providing them the security of "home" regardless of their financial situation. Finally, our Medicine from the Heart program has assisted over 100 seniors on Medicare this year by paying the copays for vital medication they otherwise couldn't afford. This program, based 100% on donations, supplemented close to \$20,000 in the past year.

The Baptist Retirement Homes Foundation proudly supports ThriveMore in all endeavors, and our mission continues to grow to assist more aging adults. Reed VanderSlik, president and CEO of ThriveMore, continues to lead our organization with purpose, upholding the importance of faith, family, and fulfillment. "We're continually working to exceed expectations in our industry while serving older adults with dignity and compassionate care," said VanderSlik.
